PRAYERS.

Mr. Lang (Saskatoon-Humboldt), a Member of the Queen's Privy Council, laid upon the Table,—Copies of Report on Delivery Quota System for Western Canadian Grain, dated February 20, 1970. (English and French). Sessional Paper No. 4/76.

The House resumed debate on the motion of Mr. Chrétien, seconded by Mr. Côté (Longueuil),—That Bill C-152, An Act to amend the National Parks Act be now read a second time and referred to the Standing Committee on Indian Affairs and Northern Development.

And debate continuing;

Mr. Lambert (Edmonton West), seconded by Mr. Macquarrie, proposed to move in amendment thereto.

That all the words after the word "That" be struck out and the following substituted therefor:

"this House holding the opinion that the Bill is repugnant in principle to the Members of this House as well as to the residents of Canada, including those of the townsites of Banff and Jasper National Parks, the persons most nearly affected by the Bill's purpose and intent, and that therefore the government should reconsider the principle of the Bill, this Bill be read a second time on a day six months hereafter."

And debate arising thereon;
