The directors have considered all the views expressed and they are pleased to give you their conclusions on abortion and that bill.

The physicians of the Quebec hospitals believe that any abortion is a homicide, because the foetus is a human being. In the present state of medicine, the foetus is a living human being and has the right to live as all other human beings. Even from a legal point of view, the foetus is already considered to be a complete human being, since he is entitled to estate rights and the State still considers non-therapeutic abortion as a crime liable to life imprisonment.

Mr. Speaker, Man is able to conceive plans of all kinds, in various areas, but he will never succeed, once dead, to bring himself back to life. In spite of science, of various discoveries, of the power of human intelligence, there has never been a man who could create something, a simple plant, a humble blade of grass. Our presence here as human beings, alive and conscious, is not due to our own will, but to the respect and the protective feeling which our parents had for life, in spite of difficulties that confronted them, and of troubles of all kind they had to endure.
