Net declines were: Pork \$1.75, lard 85c to \$1.12½, and ribs 57½c to 62½c. Wheat trâde was much contracted in volume and price changes were no more than if war was not going on at all The market early reflected in a moderate way the changed conditions in regard to the financial condition. Announcement that there would be no railroad strike had a bearish effect at first, but more confidence was shown later, especially after reports that ar-rangements were about completed for rangements were about completed for assuring speedy enlargement of ship-ments to Europe. Stop-loss selling on orders, which came into automatic operation had a good deal to do with the irregular de-cline in corn.
