Receipts of Forty-Five Hundred More Than Buyers Could Handle.

THIRD LEFT UNSOLD

Other Descriptions of Live Stock Continued Steadily to Maintain Prices.

Receipts of live stock at the Union Stock Yards on Monday were 234 carloads of live stock, comprising 4568 cattle, 1623 hogs, 236 sheep and lambs, 256 calves and 1131 horses.

The percentage of good to choice fat cattle was low as in the day, as buyers were determined to get their largest of the year this far.

The bulk of the fat cattle sold at 20c to 30c per cwt. lower than last week, with about 1500 cattle still unsold at the close of the market.

SYNOPSIS OF A CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

The sole head of a family, or any male over eighteen years of age, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district in which the land is situated.

Duties—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years after the date of the grant of the land. A homesteader who fails to comply with these conditions, except where residence is performed in accordance with the regulations, forfeits his claim to the land.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section of available Dominion land in each of the three years, cultivate fifty acres, and erect a house worth \$300.

Duties—Six months' residence in each of three years after the date of the grant of the land. A homesteader who fails to comply with these conditions, except where residence is performed in accordance with the regulations, forfeits his claim to the land.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section of available Dominion land in each of the three years, cultivate fifty acres, and erect a house worth \$300.
