Cyvillier in his place impeached Louis Charles Foucher, one of the Puisne Judges of His Majesty's Court of King's Bench for the District of Montreal for divers High Crimes and Misdemeanours and presented to the House Heads of Impeachment against the said Louis Charles Rouches, Esquire, and which said Heads of Impeachment were delivered in at the Clerks Table and are as followeth, that is to say:

Articles of Accusation and Impeachment exhibited against Louis Charles Foucher, Esquire, one of the Justices of His Majesty's Court of King's Bench for the District of Montreal.

FIRST CHARGE.

THAT the said Louis Charles Foucher, being a Judge of His Majesty's Court of King's Bench for the District of Montreal, in the Province of Lower-Canada, and also a Judge of His Majesty's Court of King's Bench for the District of Three Rivers, in the same Province hath disregarded the duties of those high and important Offices, and contrary to his oath, hath perverted the course of Justice in the said Courts, and rendered his judicial power subservient to the views of individuals whose interests he has been desirous of promoting.
