Preamble.

WHEREAS George Gurnett, Mayor of the City of Toronto, and upwards of eleven hundred others, inhabitants and freeholders of the City of Toronto and the Home and Simcoe Districts, have presented a Petition to the Legislature, praying that an Act might be passed to authorize the construction of a Railroad from the City of Toronto to some part of the southerly shore of Lake Huron, touching at the Town of Barrie or at some point or points on the shore of Lake Simcoe: And whereas the construction of such Rail-road
