With touching beauty and magic power are its properties described by the italy Catholic Church, when, on on the occasion of dedicating a Temple of Sacritice and Prayer to the Lord, she directs her Pontiffs to hollow the water of Instruction used in the ceremony, apostrophizing the liquid element in this wise :--

" Be then hallowed by the word of God, O heavenly Water; be thon hallowed O Water trodden by the footsteps of Christ ! Pressed by mountains then are not shut up, cashed against rocks then art not broken; poured out through the earth, thou dost not fail. Thou bearest the dry land, thou sustainest the weight of mountains, yet sinkest not. On the summit of the heavens art thou contained; thoroughly diffused through all, thou washest all, nor art thou washed thyself. Hardened into a mass wert thou bound up to secure the flight of the Hebrew people. Thon, unbound again in bring whirlpeels, destroyest the sojourners of the Nile, and with raying billows dost pursue their hostile band, being at the same time salvation to the faithful, and punishment to the wicked. Thou didst guch forth from the rock when it was stricken by Moses, nor couldst then remain concealed within its erags, when, bidden by the power of Majesty, thou camest forth. Thou being borne in the clouds dost fertilize the fields with joyful showers. By thee into badies parched by heat, is poured drink, to taste grateful, and for health salubrious. Through immost channels streaming than dost, enclosed, yield vital air, or fertilising juice, lest the earth exhausted from its arid womb. should refuse to bring forth its wanted supply. By thee, the beginning, by thee the end rejoiceth, or rather it is from God that we know net thy bounds-neither those of Thy operations, O God Abnighty, of whose powers being mindful, we proclaim thy glorious works while, we aunonace the benefits of water."
