## ORDER OF BYLAWS IS NOW SETTLED

Sick Children's Bylaw Placed  
First and That of Con-  
sumption Is Sev-  
enth.

## EIGHT MONEY BYLAWS

City May Purchase Humber  
River Property For Gen-  
eral Boulevard  
Scheme.

The following is the order in which  
the bylaws will be presented to the  
people on January 1 next:

(1) \$250,000 grant to the Sick Child-

ren's Hospital.

(2) \$8,777,000 additions and exten-

sions to waterworks plant.

(3) \$1,375,000 additions to water-

works filtration plant.

(4) \$250,000 storm overflow sewers.

(5) \$2,500,000 Elbow street viaduct.

(6) \$1,000,000 garbage and refuse dis-

posal plant.

(7) \$200,000 grant to National Sanitar-

ium.

(8) \$100,000 good roads and high-

ways.

The mayor wanted all revenue pro-

ducing schemes placed on a separate

order paper, as this will give the elec-

tors a better opportunity to discrimi-

nate properly should they choose,

when casting their ballots.

"I am in favor of putting the two

hospital bylaws together," said he,

"that is the only proper way. I don't

see the advisability of placing them so

apart, one is placed first and the

other seventh."

"Let them go just as they are," said

Controller McCarthy.

Outside of this, little interest was

evidenced by the majority of the board

of control as to the order, so they will

be left as they are.

Humber Property.

Commissioner Forman will look into

the proposal to purchase the old Humber

River's mouth, which will facilitate

the harbor boulevard scheme.

"The city should have acquired this

land long ago," declared Controller

McCarthy. "It would have helped

make one of the finest parks on the

continent. We could have obtained it

at small cost then."

Controller McCarthy: "Let the har-

bor commissioners deal with the own-

ers and come to us with a reasonable

offer, and we will be glad to do it,"

he stated that should the city decide

upon granting his request, these as-

## TRAFFIC REPORT IN COUNSEL'S HANDS

Conference Will Be Held on  
Advisability of Giving It  
Publicity—Controllers  
Want to See It.

## ORDERED BY DRAYTON

Council Appropriates Sufficient  
Funds For Purpose of  
Obtaining Report For  
Evidence Only.

It was unexpectedly divulged at the

board of control yesterday that Messrs.

Arnold Moyes' report on the local

traffic problems was in the hands of

Corporation Counsel Geary, and he

would, so far as can be ascertained,

keep it for private use, as it was origi-

nally intended to do by H. L. Dray-

ton when he was corporation counsel.

The present members of the board

of control are anxious to take a glance

somewhat at it, and guardedly ex-

pressed themselves to that effect yes-

terday, with the result that the mayor

will endeavor to arrange a conference

between Mr. Geary and the board on

the report as soon as circumstances

will permit.

"We have got to be fair to the pub-

lic," declared Controller Maguire, "and

therefore we should be given an op-

portunity to see the report."

anybody who has a right to see it,"
