**HOME FOR RAILROAD MEN.**  
Committee Visits Colorado Springs and is Impressed.

Colorado Springs Gazette (Sept. 26): The committee of five appointed by the Brotherhood of Railroad Trainmen, at its recent convention at Buffalo, to select a site for a home in Colorado Springs, arrived here yesterday morning. The committee is composed of Robert McIntyre of Tucson, Ariz.; J. L. Shaw of Northampton, Mass.; W. L. Barrett of Kansas City; W. L. Moorhead of Columbia, S.C.; and C. P. Clark of Toronto, Ont.

Clark members of the committee came to Colorado Springs quietly yesterday morning. Upon their arrival they immediately telephoned Charles Deacon, superintendent of the Printers' Home, and made arrangements to visit that institution. They spent two hours there, inspecting every room of the building, and were greatly pleased with what they saw.

"They were greatly impressed," said Mr. Deacon last night, "and seem to think that Colorado Springs is a great place for the establishment of a home." The Railway Trainmen's Association is one of the largest, if not the largest, organization of its kind in the world. It includes practically every railroad man in North America. The brotherhood has planned to build two homes in two different cities; one for trainmen afflicted with tuberculosis and one for the aged and infirm. Las Vegas, New Mexico, and Kansas City, Mo., are the strongest bidders for the homes, but it has been left to this committee, and it is expected that Colorado Springs will take first place in the race.
