ADVENTURER HAS STRENUOUS TRIP

Takes Supplies to Hudson Bay and Encounters Ice, Snow and Storm.

Ottawa, Ont., Oct. 25. - Advices have reached the mounted police department from Hudson bay with reference to Maj. Moodie's expedition. were brought down by the steamship Adventure, which was specially chartered for the purpose of conveying a detachment of mounted far north. Sydney was left on Aug. 3, the Adventure having on board 1,000 tons of coal and 600 tons of general cargo. The vessel arrived at Port Burwell, in the Ungava bay, at the entrance to Hudson strait, one week later. where 50 tons of coal were discharged. She then proceeded to the police post at Cape Fullerton, in the northwest corner of Hudson bay, 900 miles from Burwell. Heavy pack ice was met on the journey. She remained there until Aug. 31, during which time rain fell almost constantly, but 6,000 sacks of coal and supplies were put ashore and three police constables landed. Churchill. 350 miles further south, was reached on Sept. 2. It is situated at the estuary of the Churchill river, and is spoken of as the terminus of the proposed railway from Winnipeg. A nine-knot current runs in the river, and the vessel had to anchor a long way out, as the tides fall from 30 to 40 feet, leaving 1,500 feet of rock and sand bare at low water. The work of discharging was very slow; 500 tons of cargo and 3,000 sacks of coal were put ashore. The weather was very stormy, and at times boats could not leave the ship. Two boats were driven ashore and wrecked, and two other boats attached to the stern of the steamer sank. The two gasoline launches were repeatedly injured by contact with the rocks. After this spell the weather suddenly changed, becoming colder, with fierce snowstorms. Fearing to remain any longer, Capt. Couch, of the Adventure, left on Oct. 1, with the balance of the coal, some 4,000 sacks. It was then freezing hard at night, and six inches of snow lay on the ground.
