BEST COURSE SCORE BY GEORGE S. LYON

Annual Senior Golf Championship Is Now Under

Ottawa, Sept. 8.—With an entry list of competitors from as far east as Sydney and as far west as Calgary, and with representatives present from practically every other golfing centre of importance in Canada, the annual championship tournament of the Canadian Seniors' Golf Association was commenced today on the course of the Royal Ottawa Golf Club. Play took place in classes A, B and C, and, in the afternoon, there was an annual handicap match and the putting competition. The championship

decided by the best two rounds of medal play, the honor going to the player with the lowest gross score. There will be a foursome tomorrow, and Friday the big tournament will be brought to a close with an international match between the Canadian and the United States seniors.

The best gross score on the day's round was turned in by George S. Lyon of the Lambton Golf Club, Toronto, many times champion of Canada. Max, 36, is 63 years of age, and was thus handicapped in class B, but he played in the form of a rising young star, and turned in a card of 77 for the day.

The best net score of the day was made by J. L. Weller, of St. Catharines. Competing in Class A, Weller had a handicap of 11. He went around in 86 so his net score was 69. This incidentally gave him the best net score of the day. His 80 was also the best gross in that class.

C. S. Harding, Beaconsfield Golf Club, Montreal, is leading in Class C, with

net score of 75. In Class B, Judge Weir, with a net of 72, leads the handicapped class. The best gross score in Class C was 90, and was held by C. S. Macdonald in each class.
