he does not need overtime for that. With regard to the last question, neither I nor my officials caught it. I would appreciate him repeating it.

Mr. Rodriguez: I would like to know the rationale. The minister said earlier there would be a non-payment of an employee's familiarization flight taken in conjunction with his days of rest. What is the rationale for that?

Mr. Munro (Hamilton East): Mr. Chairman, I will endeavour to get an answer to the hon. member's question. We had some difficulty in understanding what the hon. member was getting at.

Mr. Rodriguez: The agreement specifically prohibits payment to employees for familiarization flights on their days of rest. Why can an employee not be paid when he takes his familiarization flight on his days of rest? There must be a reason for putting that into the collective agreement.

Mr. Munro (Hamilton East): If the hon. member would refer to Schedule IV he would find that it is based on a letter of intent between the parties. It was previously provided that familiarization flights would not be taken on days of rest. Now, this is to be changed so that days of rest can be taken in conjunction with familiarization flights, which means that many of the controllers will be in a position to utilize some of their free time for familiarization flights.
