Accessibility.

Stanstead is a terminus of the Passumpsic River R. R., which makes three principal connections:—

- 1st. At SHERBROOKE, P.Q., with the Grand Trunk for Richmond, Montreal, Quebec, and all points North.
- 2nd. At NEWPORT, VT., with the South Eastern R. R., for Cowalsville, Richford, N.Y., St. Albans, N.Y., St. Johns, Montreal, and all points West.
- 3rd. At WHITE RIVER JUNCTION with direct lines to Springfield, Boston, New York, and all points South.

Perhaps no other point in the Province can be so easily reached by the greatest number of those whose interests the College is intended to serve.

From the above sketch it will be seen that the building in all its appointments and surroundings is most admirably adapted to the requirements of an Educational Institute, and taken in connection with the wide range of departments, the high order and thoroughness of the instruction given, and the effective Christian influence which is sought to be exerted, the Institution fully accords with the advanced and progressive movement of the times, and embodies the ideal of its projectors, a "real People's College."
