WOULD ADOPT HONEST GIRL

Wealthy Woman Impressed by Return of Bag Containing \$1,000

New York, Oct. 17.—Mrs. C. C. Munson, a wealthy woman, of 62 Lincoln avenue, Grantwood, N.J., impressed by the honesty of an eleven-year-old girl, who had turned over to the Edgewater police a bag containing \$1,000 which Mrs. Munson had lost a few hours before, indicated that she would try to adopt the child. In fact, she had a talk with the family with whom the child, an orphan, is now living at Tenafly, but was not able to induce them to part with the girl.

Mrs. Munson and some friends went out in a motor boat on the Hudson. Mrs. Munson took along a knitting bag in which she had placed a purse containing money and jewelry valued at about \$1,000. She did not notice that she had lost the bag until she returned home late in the afternoon, and then she notified the police.

In the meantime Clementine Derrick had found the bag on the road near the Edgewater ferry, and turned it over to the police. Mrs. Munson later identified the bag and went to Tenafly, failing to get the family to permit her to adopt the girl, handed the child a \$100 bill. Mrs. Munson says she has not given up hope of inducing the foster parents of the child to turn her over to her for adoption.
