## Who Will Enlist In the 55th Battalion?

THE PERIOD OF ENLISTMENT is for the duration of the war

between Great Britain and Germany and six months after if required.

THE RATE OF PAY. For Private \$1 per day, also 10 cents field pay for seven days a week, equal to \$33 per month and found; for Corporal \$1.10 per day, also 10 cents field pay; for Sergeant \$1.35 per day, also 10 cents per day and additional pay for special employment as cooks, etc.

A SEPARATION ALLOWANCE. \$2) per month wil be paid to the wife of every soldier or to his widowed mother if he is her sole sipport.

ASSIGNED PAY. Every soldier whose wife or moter receives the separation allowance must assin one-half his pay which will be paid direct to his wife or mother. More thn one-half may be assigned.

PENSIONS. If rendered "totally incapable," \$264 a year; if "incap-able," \$192 a year; if "materially incapable," \$132 a year; if "in a small degree incapable," \$75 per year. If sergeant thes amounts will be increased to \$336, \$252, \$168, \$100 respectively. To vidows of privates \$22 per month and \$5 per month for each child. To widows of ser-geants \$28 per month and \$5 per month for each child. Widower mothers whose son was sole support, on same basis. For orphans the rate may be loubled.


