

WINE BY GLASS IS

NOT LIKELY IN B. C. Proposed Legislation Opposed and Probably Will Not be

VICTORIA, B. C., Dec. 4—Proposed egisltion to legalize the sale of wine by the glass in the establishments which

legisltion to legalize the sale of wine by the glass in the establishments which sell only beer will not now be introduced into the British Columbia Legislature, it is thought, following an attack upon the project made in the Provincial House by T. G. Coventry, Conservative, of Sannich, a Vancouver Island district adjacent to Victoria, where large quantities of loganberries are grown for wine.

Coventry's attack, it is understood, followed representations of the loganberry growers themselves, who had been relied upon by advocates of the plan to support it.


Sannich fruit growers, according to Coventry, believe that the introduction of wine into beer parlors would discredit the entire system of private sale, and perhaps lead to the ultmiate ruin of their present sale of wine through government stores. As he explained their views, they believe loganberry wine by itself to be a "satisfactory beverage," but, mixed with others, likely to cause serious trouble.



Madame Tolstoy, with whom I chatted yesterday, is on her first visit to England, has much of the penetrating and idealistic force of personality that made her father world famous and his name a factor for posterity.
