

John McAlpine Siddall, editor of the American Magazine since 1915, died yesterday afternoon at his summer residence at Ardsley-on-Hudson after a prolonged illness.

Mr. Siddall spent his youth between college and newspaper offices and applied the fruits of his early labors to collect "personals" for the local paper, for which he received \$1 a column.

At the end of the school semester, as Cleveland paper offered him \$10 a week to gather police news. He accepted, but upon the advice of his collecting the editorial policy of the magazine, it had a circulation of less than 400,000 copies a menth,


