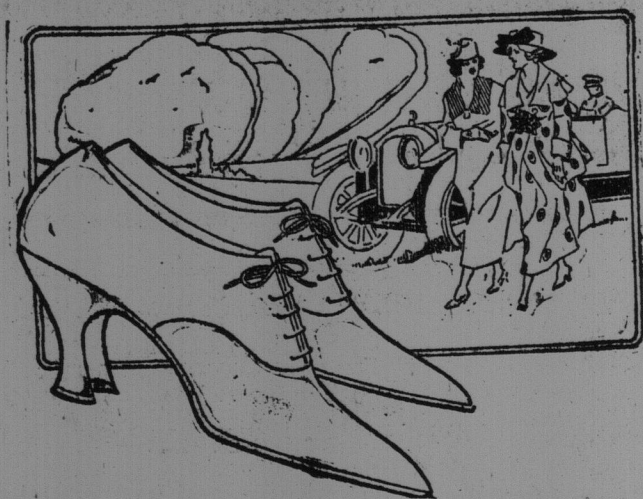

### MARKETING GARDEN TRUCK.

Nine out of ten war gardeners are able to use most of the vegetables they grow but among those who have gone in for vacant lot gardening there will be some who will want to market their produce. The community spirit pays in this as in most other things.

A case in point is a project put forward by the Women's Canadian Club of Ottawa. Last year they had a way-side market and through this medium \$750 was made on the sale of vegetables. This year they are to have a motor truck which will bring the produce right into the city to be sold at street corners.

This is a novel scheme that might be adopted in other cities. The way-side markets have proved lucrative as they have been well patronized by motorists and wayfarers of every class.

A motor truck in a country community may be made the means of transporting to the city market the produce of a score of war gardens. Fresh, good-looking vegetables are always easy enough to sell. The biggest difficulty presented as a general rule is transportation. This may be overcome by team-work on the part of war gardeners.

Mrs. Muldrew's Address.

Mrs. Jean Muldrew made good her title of food control and conservation expert in her address given under the auspices of the Housewives' League in the war veterans' hall yesterday afternoon when she expounded the work of the food board and told of the individual responsibility which rests upon every Canadian and American to save food for the Allies and for the neutral nations of Europe. She had complete knowledge of her subject and presented it in a very understandable and interesting manner.

Announcement was made at the meeting that the food board had undertaken to pay the rent of the Calvin church basement for three months so that, if the local government will, the city can have a place for the holding of food demonstrations. It was also brought to the notice of the meeting that this morning the city commissioners will be interviewed, on the subject of the wrapping of bread in the city, the authorities at Ottawa having signified their willingness for local action in this matter.

U. S. Officers Decorated.  
London, July 17.—General John J. Pershing has been awarded the grand cross of the Order of the Bath and General Tasker H. Bliss, American representative at the supreme war council has been given the grand cross of the Order of St. Michael and St. George. This was officially announced today.
