Daily Hints For the Cook

MOCK MINCE PIE. Roll three comon crackers fine and pour over them 1 1-4 cups of hot water, on cup of molasses, one cup of sugar, half a cup of butter, half a cup of vinegar, one cup of raisins cut fine with the scissors, two eggs, one teaspoon of cinnamon, half a teaspoon of clove, a little salt and

a nutmeg, grated. This is enough for three MOLASSES GINGERBREAD One cup of molasses, one of boiling water, little salt, tablespoon shortening, one teaspoon of soda and flour to make rather stiff. I use a heaping teaspoon of ginger but it does not make it taste very stron of flavor, so more could be used if liked.

MARBLE CAKE

Half a cup of butter (or butter and shortening mixed to make half a cup) and a cup of sugar creamed together. Add the yolks of 2 eggs and beat until light, then add the whites (that have been whipped separately), half a cup of milk and 1 1: cups of flour in which has been sifted a heaping teaspoon of baking powder. Separater the batter into two parts. To one part add the chopped meats of a pound of walnuts and to the other a heaping tablespoon of cocoa, wet with a little ho tablespoon of cocoa, wet with a little hot water, and a cup of chopped raisins. Put into the pan alternately a spoonful of dark and a spoonful of light.
