missionary Schemes of the Church and other benevolent objects contained in the schedule. Nearly two-thirds of the Congregation have by this shewing given nothing for the missionary purposes of the Church during the past year.

It will be for the Committee for the ensuing year to consider whether a special effort, by visitation or otherwise, should not be made to get a

larger return of schedules.
