

- A. 35 He was up by the canteen and the other boys were with him and he handed some beer out the window.
- Q. 36 Who did he hand it to?
- A. 36 Casey and McFee.
- Q. 37 Then what happened?
- A. 37 They took it and drank it and then "Red" went back again and reached out the window and handed two more bottles to them.
- Q. 38 Who handed two more out?
- A. 38 "Red", and McFee and Casey both asked him if it was all right if they took it to their aunts and he told them to hurry back, they did not want to get caught, and they went in the house and came right back and gave "Red" back the bottles and "Red" hung on to them until they came to the canteen. They both tried to give "Red" a quarter and he would not take it and they put it in his pocket. Then we left after we took the bottles back.
- Q. 39 This fifty cents, did the accused keep it?
- A. 39 Yes Sir.
- Q. 40 The person you call "Red" can you point him out?
- A. 40 Yes Sir. The one in the middle. (The witness pointed to the accused).

- A. 41 Yes Sir, they asked him for it.
