- A.409 I could not say, Sir.
- Q.410 Was there any light reflection in the mirror?
- A.410 Once in a while, Sir.
- Q.411 As a result of the car behind you?
- A.411 Yes, Sir.
- Q.412 Was there fog ahead on the road just previous to the accident?
- A.412 There was, Sir.
- Q.413 Was the road straight at this point?
- A.413 I think it was, Sir.
- Q.414 You think it was straight?
- A.414 Yes, Sir.
- Q.415 Was it necessary for you to call the attention of the driver to switch over on the road or would it have been possible for him to have done that without your calling his attention to it?
- A.415 I don't believe it would, Sir.
