

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR MAJESTY. E, your Majesty's dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Commons of Newfoundland, having freely and voluntarily resolved to give and grant unto your Majesty a supply to defray certain charges for the support of the Civil Government, for the administration of Justice, and the general improvement of this Colony, do humbly beseech your Majesty that it may be enacted, and

Be it therefore enacted, by the Governor, Council, and Assembly of Newfoundland, in general Assembly convened, that from and out of such monies as from time to time shall be and remain in the hands of the Treasurer of this Island, and unappropriated, there shall be granted to Her Majesty, hes Heirs, and successors, the sum of Ten Thousand Six Hundred and Forty Nine Pounds Eight Shillings and Fourpence halfpenny, which said sum shall be applied in payment of the following charge for the year commemcing on the first day of July One thousand eight hundred and thirty nine, and ending on the thirtieth day of June One thousand eight hundred and forty, inclusive, that is to say :-The sum of Two hundred pounds to-
