

n." Three vocal roars followed. From one of the boxes came the y "Three cheers for Mr. Gerard," d the response was unanimous. But the real spirit of the demonstration came when from far up in one of the galleries a man's voice pipone of the galleries a man's voice pip-d:-"Three cheers for our allies." Then the audience, unusually the personification of conventionality, lost control of itself. It howled for the allies and continued yelling long after the last of the three cheers had found accentuation in that voical din. Men advanced to the front of the boxes in the two rows and waved their hands over their heads. Women cried as they waved the taile scarfs that adorned their evening costumes. Even that was not the end of the extraordinary demonstration of pa-triotic feeling. Mr. Bodansky waved aloft his baton and a second time the orchestra struck up the national an-them. This time every one present sang in full voice from first note to last.
