

MINERS READY TO ACCEPT CUT IN THEIR WAGES

Miner Leader Urges Need of Organizing a National Pool. ARE OPPOSED TO GOVERNMENT CONTROL. Much Better to Make Terms Satisfactory to Men He Claims.

London, April 15.—Frank Hodges, secretary of the Miners' Union, in a letter to the London Times, says that the miners have refused to make substantial contributions to the industry in the direction of wiping out the present deficit by agreeing to a uniform reduction of wages throughout the country.

The letter is a direct reply to an emphasis of the need of a national pool and in supporting the miners' opposition to a national pool. It charges that the Government action is responsible for the crisis and asserts there is a lack of interest of the members of the federation.

Mr. Hodges said the owners and workmen need no external arrangement help to put into effect the principles governing the national wage movements which he has advocated.

Outlining the federation's scheme for a national pool, he said: "It is true it cannot be applied at once owing to abnormal conditions of trade in this country, and some financial assistance is necessary."
