Lodge Proceedings should be read to al! the Lodges in the jurisdiction, specially summoned for the purpose. Our greatest danger lies in ignorance. Therein is the field for the spread of skepticism."

Like him, we should greatly enjoy meeting our Brothers of the Masonic corps reportorial this year at Chicago. But we doubt whether it is worth while discussing the lawfulness of placing the preparation-room door in the Lodge room on the right of the Senior Warden in the West. It is far more important that wherever it be located it be well and worthily guarded. Not many candidates take much note of the particular angle of the Lodge that they enter for the first time. With the subsequent proceedings it is, of course, somewhat different.
