

and also to rescind or amend the law requiring ministers from other churches to give a year in the mission field, before being eligible for a call.

Mr. A. Henderson, of Appin, supported the overture.

After discussion and the proposing of several motions, it was agreed to consider the two parts of the overture seriatim. On motion by Mr. Henderson, seconded by Mr D. M. Beattie, the first part of the overture was unanimously adopted.

At this stage the hour of adjournment arrived, and the Synod accordingly adjourned to meet again at 2 p.m.

The Synod proceeded to consider the second part of the overture from London Presbytery, which asks the General Assembly to rescind or amend the law requiring ministers from other churches to give a year in the Mission field, before being eligible for a call.
