FOUND GUILTY.

Toronto, Dec. 18.—For the death of Mary Atkins, Frank Smith and William Broom were held responsible by a jury on Saturday afternoon, and this morning the two men will be tried before the judge at the Assizes and be sentenced for their crime. Ottawa, Dec. 18.—In 1875 the Depart-
