

trivance, whereby risk of accident by fire may be occasioned, shall be built in the City or Suburbs, upon a wooden foundation, unless the same be erected upon a base of stone or brick immediately under such oven or furnace, or other such contrivance, of at least eighteen inches in thickness. All ovens and furnaces, and all such contrivances so built, shall also have a good and sufficient pavement of stone or brick of at least three feet in breadth, and the like in length, and at least eighteen inches in thickness in the front thereof; and every person offending against this Regulation, shall pay a fine of forty shillings, and ten shillings each day, so long as such oven or furnace, or such contrivance, shall remain contrary to this Regulation. All masons or workmen, who shall build any oven or furnace, or such contrivance, contrary thereto, shall forfeit and pay the like penalty of forty shillings. No oven or furnace, nor any contrivance as above mentioned, shall be built in any court yard joining to a dwelling house or out-house, or otherwise, in the City or Suburbs, unless the mouth of such oven or furnace, or such contrivance, shall open into a chimney of such dwelling house, out-house, or other covered buildings, under the penalty of forty shillings, to be paid by the proprietor or occupier; and under the like penalty to be paid by the workman employed in build-
