C A P. XXII.

An Act for making perpetual several Laws relating to permitting the Exportation of Tobacco Pipe Clay from *Great Britain* to the *British* Sugar Colonies in the *West Indies*; the Importation of Salt from *Europe* into *Quebec* in *America*; and the prohibiting of Foreign-wrought Silks and Velvets.

[21st March 1808.]

**W**HEREAS the Laws herein-after mentioned have by Experience been found useful and beneficial, and it is expedient that the same should be made perpetual; be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That so much of an Act made in the Seventeenth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for repealing the Eleventh Rule in the Book of Rates, so far as the same relates to making any Allowance upon the Importation of damaged Currants and Raisins; and for making the Importer of such Goods an Abatement in the Duties in lieu thereof; and for explaining the said Rule with respect to such Allowance for Damage on other Goods; and to permit the Exportation of Tobacco Pipe Clay from this Kingdom to the British Sugar Colonies or Plantations in the West Indies, for a limited Time; as permits the Exportation of Tobacco Pipe Clay from this Kingdom to the British Sugar Colonies or Plantations in the West Indies, which was to continue in force until the*
