## Things look up

Mississauga Hospital is \$334,000 closer to its \$1.75 million fundraising goal, hospital development officer Lyle Doering announced last week.

Doering said the campaign gained about \$54,000 in one week with the help of hefty grants from the two oil companies. Imperial Oil contributed \$20,000 early last week and Gulf Oil handed over a \$25,000 check last Thursday.

The cost of the expansion and renovation program is about \$36.5 million with heavy funding coming from the provincial and regional governments.

When completed in 1982, the program will add 133 beds to the hospital, bringing the total to 628. It will result in the creation of about 600 new jobs.

The aim of the campaign is to increase the number of active care beds from 2.1 per thousand population to 2.8 per thousand. The Ontario average for active care beds is 4.2 per thousand people.

## School borders reset

Not all the primary students living in the new Creditview community north of Burnhamthorpe Road will be directed to Ellengale Public School as originally proposed.

In June, the Peel Board of Education indicated that kindergarten to Grade 6 students in Creditview would attend Ellengale in Credit Woodlands. It was thought that all of the students should be directed there to ensure that the capacity of the school was high enough to prevent it from being closed.

A report to the board last week stated if the original proposal is carried through Ellengale would likely need portables by 1983, while Queenston Drive Public School in the Woodlands would have empty space.

The board adopted a staff proposal to have all Creditview students living west of Mavis Road directed to Queenston Heights. Kindergarten to Grade 5 students east of Mavis will attend Ellengale while Grade 6 to 8 students in that area attend Queenston.
