No. 3 S.F.T.S., Calgary, Alberta.	17-4-41		was held at 1430 hours at I.T.S. Drill Square, Currie Barracks. Taxiing accident between Anson 6329, pilot IAC G.C. Boyer and Anson 6400, pilot IAC J. Fairfield; both aircraft damaged, no injuries to personnel.	
	18-4-41		Wing Commander A.D. Ross returned to the Station by air at 1630 hours from temporary duty at No. 4 T.C. Regina. The Officers held a mess dinner at 1730 hours with 51 Officers present and the following guests, Colonel J.W. Littleton, Wing Commander N.E. Sharpe, Lieutenant De Winton, Squadron Leader D.S.
