LONDON, July 14, 1940.

CIRCULAR D. 344

Circular D. 344. Most Secret. Following for your  
Prime Minister, Begins:

Anglo-French Relations.

1. My telegram Circular D. 337, paragraph 3. Provided  
they agree to reciprocity we are accepting the French  
Government's proposal that representative should remain here,  
possibly to be described as agent of French Government in  
London. We are prepared to send representative in similar  
capacity to France but matter is open to review if French  
Government move into enemy occupied territory.

United States of America.

2. His Majesty's Ambassador at Washington has been  
informed confidentially by the State Department, that the  
United States economic proposals at Havana will not include a  
large-scale inter-American cartel for handling surpluses, but  
proposals for extension of loans by the United States  
Government Export and Import Bank may be made to assist Latin  
American countries to indebted buyers and hold surpluses where  
loss of export markets is felt severely. Ends.
