21. The Cabinet, after discussion, noted with approval the Prime Minister's observations.

Broadcasting; commercial licence

22. The Secretary submitted a recommendation to Council from the Minister of Reconstruction and Supply approved by the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation that a commercial broadcasting licence be granted to a private company for the establishment and operation of a frequency modulated broadcasting station in Montreal. It was understood that the station would be, to a lar ge extent, experimental.

(Minister's submission, Nov.29, 1946 (P.C.4965).)

23. The Cabinet, after discussion, approved the Minister's recommendation and agreed that an Order in Council be passed accordingly.

Public Service; Christmas and New Year's leave

- 24. The Minister of National Revenue, as Acting Secretary of State, pointed out that, prior to the war when the Christmas and New Year's holidays fell on a Wednesday, a full half holiday had been granted before each of these holidays to all members of the Public Service. During the war years, however, this practice had been curtailed and one-half the Public Service had been granted a half holiday before Christmas and the other half before New Year's.
- 25. The Cabinet, after discussion, agreed that the pre-war practice be resumed and that all members of the Public Service be granted a half holiday on the day preceding Christmas and on the day preceding New Year's.

Dominion-Provincial relations; old age pensions

26. The Minister of National Health and Welfare reported on discussions which had recently been held with Provincial representatives on the administration of old age pensions.

As a result of these discussions, recommendations for modification of administrative
