Dear Sir:-

I have received a letter from Mr. Indian Agent Perzy, a copy of which is hereto attached, in which he urgently requests a re-survey of Seymour Creek Indian Reserve No. 2, of the Squamish Band, and gives his reason therefor.

In view of these repressions I would recommend that the re-survey should be made, if there is money available for the purpose. I have no Field Book of this Reserve, but in all probability the Previncial Surveyor has one. I have, however, a phetostat copy of the Field Rotes of the Survey made prior to 1871 by one of the Colonial efficials, but the reserve was enlarged on the Northern end in 1876 by the joint Reserve Commission.

Will you please let me hear from you at your earliest convenience as to whether you can concur in my recommendation?
