post office in Innisfil township, Simcoe
County, 2 miles from Lefroy, on the N & N
W Ry. Nearest post office Churchill, which
see for Directory.

CHERRY GROVE. A country post
office in West Nissouri township, Middlesex
County, 20 miles north of London, the
county seat, and 4 from Kelly's siding on
the L br G T Ry, the nearest railway point.
St Mary's, 6 miles north, is the nearest
bank. Settled in 1885. It contains Metho-
dist and Episcopal churches, and a common
school, and ships produce. Mail tri-weekly.

CHERRY VALLEY. A village on
East Creek, in Athol township, Prince
Edward County, 5 miles south of Picton,
the county seat, nearest shipping and bank-
ing point. Settled in 1810. It contains a
Methodist church and a public school, and
ships grain, produce, evaporated fruits and
lumber. It is on the stage route from Picton
to Milford. Population, 175. Telegraph,
GNW. Mail daily. Wm Kenny, post-
master.

power) in Pickering township, Ontario
County, 12 miles west of Whitby, the
county seat, 6 west of Pickering, the
nearest banking point, and 4½ north-west
of Green river on the O & Q line O div
C P Ry, the nearest railway point. It
contains a Methodist church and a public
school, and ships flour and produce. Stage
three times a week to Whitevale, 4 miles
north, fare 25c. Population, 50. Mail
tri-weekly. Charles Petty, postmaster.

CHESLEY. An incorporated village
on the north branch of the Saugeen (which
furnishes excellent power) and on the G B
& L E div G T Ry, in Elderslie township,
Bruce County, 16 miles north of Walkerton,
the county seat. Settled in 1852. It has
saw, woollen and flour mills, a foundry,
cheese box factory, felt works, etc., and
contains Episcopal, Presbyterian, Methodist,
Covenanter and Baptist churches, a public
school, a bank, a volunteer fire brigade, and
a weekly newspaper, the *Enterprise*. Grain,
lumber, bark, felt goods, live stock, timber
and produce are shipped. Assessed value
of real and personal property \$202,100,
bonded indebtedness \$1,500. Stage to
Scone daily. Population, 1,300. Tele-
graph, GNW. Express, Canadian. Mail
daily. D M Halliday, postmaster.
