

THEATRE ROYAL.—Miss Clifton, the celebrated American actress was announced to appear in Quebec on Thursday evening last in the character of Belvidera in Otway's tragedy of *Venice Preserved*; but in consequence of the extreme inclemency of the weather, no performance took place.

Last night, the performances were *The Youthful Queen*, *Perfection*, and *The Dutch Belle*, and were by command of the Governor General, on which occasion His Excellency, with the Countess of Durham and family, honored the theatre with their presence. The acting of Miss Ellen Tree, who appeared for the last time in Quebec, was loudly applauded; and the whole performances went off much to the satisfaction of a crowded audience.

Miss Clifton, who is engaged for three nights only, will make her first appearance this evening as Belvidera.

Yesterday afternoon, between three and four o'clock, as a respectable female of the name of Elizabeth Benning, was returning home from this city to her father's residence, near St. Pierre Race Course, she was stopped by a Canadian, who presented a butcher's knife to her breast, and threatened to stab her. He seized at the same time her reticule, which contained a small sum of money, and a pocket handkerchief, with her name on it, and carried the whole away with him. The highwayman is represented by the female robbed, as about thirty years of age, and five feet six or seven inches high. He had large black whiskers, full eyes and had on an old black hat and brown coat.—*Montreal Gazette*.
