heavy, 83 to 83.75; light, 84 to 84.50;  
spring lambs, 85.00 to 89; yearling lambs,  
wt., 85.00 to 85.50; buck and culls, 83 to  
85.50; calves are quoted at 84 to 87.50.  
Hogs have advanced 20c to 25c. The de-  
mand is good and receipts fairly liberal.  
Packers are paying 87.10 to 87.15 f.o.b.  
shipping points.

At Montreal live stock is higher. The  
demand was liberal and receipts a moder-  
ately small particularly of first quality  
steers. Choice steers sold at \$6.50 to 6.75;  
700 lbs. at 86 to 86.25; 550 lbs. at 85.75;  
common, 84.50 to 84.75; culls, 84.25 to 85-  
25; and bulls, \$5.50 to \$5.85.

The market for lambs was much  
stronger and prices showed a sharp ad-  
vance sales being made at 85 to 87 cwt. each.  
Sleep were unchanged at \$2.00 to 8c each.  
Calves are quoted at 84 to 88 each ac-  
cording to size and quality.

## MONTREAL HOG MARKET.

Montreal, Saturday, June 24.—The re-  
ceipts of live hogs this week were rather  
light and met with a good demand. Of-  
ferings were cleared out at an advanced  
price over those paid a week ago. Se-  
lected hogs dressed off cars sold as high  
as 87.25 a cwt. an advance of 25c a cwt.  
on the week. There is a fair and quick  
demand for dressed hogs and fresh killing  
abattoir stock is quoted at \$10.25 to \$10.50  
a cwt.

## CHEESE MARKETS.

Farmland, Que., June 19—513 boxes of  
butter; 227 boxes sold at a good demand.  
A. Madoc, June 21—945 boxes boarded; 400  
at 11 1/2c, 370 at 11 1/4c. Balance re-  
corded.

Peterboro, June 21—3386 boxes boarded.  
Board cleared; price, 11 5/16c.  
Vanhook Hill, June 21—1930 boxes  
boarded. All sold at 11 1/4c.

Kingston, June 22—487 boxes of white  
and 577 colored boarded. Sales were made  
at 11 1/16c to 11 1/8c.

Winchester, June 22—1056 boxes registered;  
11 1/2c was offered and 196 white sold  
on the board.

Ottawa, June 23—1064 cheese boarded;  
all sold at 11 1/8c for white and 11 5/16c  
for colored.

Kempville, June 23—998 cheese boarded;  
369 sold at 11 1/8c.

Pictou, June 23—2532 boxes; all sold at  
11 1/4c.

Napanee, June 23—1175 white and 70  
colored cheese sold. Board price, 11c.

Brockville, June 24—565 boxes of which  
223 were colored, were offered. Bids  
ranged from 11c to 11 1/4c, but found no  
takers. The board advanced without a  
sale being recorded. On the street the  
factories were at the mercy of the buyers,  
as the cheese had gone forward on Fri-  
day, the regular shipping day, to the  
warehouses of houses to which the sales-  
men sell regularly. Now it is a question  
of fixing the price to be paid for the ac-  
cidents, which is a matter of conjecture  
only.

Watertown, N.Y., June 24—Cheese—Sales,  
10,000 at 11c 1/4 to 1 1/4c for large.

Belleisle, June 24—33 factories boarded  
2,525 cheese, all white. All were sold at  
11 1/4c to 11 1/4c.

London, Ont., June 24, — 773 boxes of  
few biddings, 11c to 11 1/4c.

Cowanville, Que., June 24 — Eastern  
Townships Dairymen's Association, board-  
ed 2066 packages of butter and 76 boxes of  
cheese. Six packages were sold at 22 1/2c.  
45 packages of butter sold at 22 1/4c.  
Cheese all sold at 10 7/8c.

St. Hyacinthe, Que., June 24—850 boxes  
of cheese sold at 10 3/4c, and 450 packages  
of butter sold at 22 1/8c, and 550 packages  
of colored cheese sold. Board price, 11 1/8c.

## EXPORT BUTTER AND CHEESE.

MONTREAL, Saturday, June 24. — The  
course of the market this week for cheese  
has been much interfered with by the  
Coronation holidays, and practically no  
business has been done with the other  
side since the first half of the week. Some  
of the country markets usually held on  
Thursday were postponed until Friday  
and Saturday and others were postponed  
to place on Wednesday. The prices paid at  
these markets ranged from 11c, which was  
the ruling price paid at Trois Rivieres and  
other eastern points, up to 11 1/2c at pre-  
toronto. This wide range of prices was  
due to the local advices from the other  
side, where a number of houses were  
closed for half of the week on account of  
the coronation festivities. As an immed-  
iate result the shipments this week have  
fallen off considerably, the total aggregat-  
ing about 55,000 boxes for the week,  
whereas receipts at Montreal, Ontario,  
amounted to over 60,000 boxes, leaving  
over 50,000 boxes to be carried over, and  
consequently suggesting the already  
large stock of cheese in store here. This  
heavy stock is sure to act as a damper on  
the market, as there is a general feeling  
that prices are going to react next week,  
and that prices will rule considerably  
lower than they have for two or three  
weeks past. Cable advices from the other  
side tell of general rains, which were  
badly needed, and will help to improve  
the market there, and there is not likely  
to be any rush for cheese unless prices  
come down to a lower level.

The butter market is gradually easing  
off and prices this week end at country  
markets have declined about one half  
cent a pound from last week. The quotat-  
ions ranging from 21 1/2c to 22c a lb. com-  
pared with 22 1/2c to 22 3/4c last week.

## LYNEODOH AYRSHIRES

Our herd of Ayrshires are doing fine,  
writes Wm. Thom, of Lynedoch, Ont.  
They are milking well and are a fair  
way of making good records. I have  
made several sales lately. Mr. A. H.  
Trimble, of Red Deer, Alberta, visited our  
herd and purchased seven head, consist-  
ing of four cows, two year-old, and one  
yearling. Among the cows he got  
Lyle's Gair. She qualified last year, giv-  
ing 9,000 lbs. of milk in less than nine  
months. He also got Red Rose 2nd, a four-  
year-old, running in the E. of F., in  
six months, with second calf, she has  
given 5,981.5 lbs. of milk, testing 5.6 per  
cent, butter fat. She gave 437 lbs. a  
cwt. in January and 1,223.7 lbs. in  
the month. Glen Hurst Pearl, a handsome  
young cow running in the Records, went  
to Mr. Trimble also. She has given in  
three months and twelve days 3,455.5 lbs.  
of milk, testing 5.2. The other cow he got  
is a right good one. The three  
yearlings were nice ones sired by my stock  
bull, Hole House Pilot (imp.), and out of  
Barbecke Juniper (imp).

I have also sold two calves to Mr. H.  
J. Elliott, Tyneside; also one young bull,  
11 months old, to Miss Jane McArthur,  
North Lanark, Ont.

My two-year-old heifer, Hole House  
Flirt, has completed her yearly milk test,  
giving me 10,265.5 lbs. of milk in the  
year, testing 5.6 per cent. Ayrshire  
Beauty, two-year-old, is just completing  
her yearly milk yield of 8,000 lbs. or bet-  
ter. I have a ten-year-old milking that  
has given in four months and 14 days  
4,516.5 lbs. milk, testing to 4.4. She gave  
as high as 42 lbs. a day in February.  
The demand for Ayrshires is still in-  
creasing.
