Went into the further consideration of "a bill for relief of insolvent Debtors, with respect to the imprisonment of their persons." House in Committee.

The *Speaker* resumed the chair.

The Committee reported the bill with amendments, by the title of "a bill for the support and relief of confined Debtors." Report of the Committee.

Which report was accepted, and the bill being read was agreed to as amended, and ordered to be engrossed.

The Committee appointed to examine the Treasurer's accounts, made the following report :

" We the Committee appointed to examine the accounts of RICHARD SEAMAN, Esq. Treasurer, beg leave to report that we have examined and attentively compared his general account with his book of entries, and the several vouchers produced by him to us, and find the Debtor side of the said account to correspond with the said book, and the creditor side thereof with several warrants under the hand and seal of his Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, issued pursuant to an Act of the last Sessions of Assembly for appropriating and disposing of the public monies, directed to and paid by him the said RICHARD SEAMAN, as Treasurer as aforesaid."
