Both Sexes Between 15 and 60 Must Serve the State.

A despatch from nome says: From March 20 to 31 the Italian Govern-ment called upon civilians of both sexes, between the ages of 15 and 60 years, to enroll for voluntary service, clving part or all of their time, without pay, to aid the following industries: Agriculture, metallurgical, tex-tile, chemical, building and road mak-


