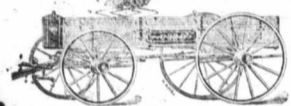

## SYNOD IS OVER.

### Church Parliament Concluded Its Session With an Interesting Missionary Meeting.

At the C. of E. Synod on Thursday afternoon on motion of Rev. J. de Soyres the following named were appointed a committee upon Reading circles, the Lord Bishop, Very Rev. Dean Partridge, Archdeacon Neales, Rev. at St. Roy Campbell, Rev. J. de Soyres stated that he would give a prize of \$50 for best essay on a subject in church history to be chosen by the Lord Bishop. His Lordship announced that he would appoint as a subject for the first competition, the Council of Nisea.

Moved by Mr. W. M. Jarvis, seconded by Rev. John de Soyres, that the Lord Bishop be requested to issue an annual pastoral urging upon the clergy that there be taken up yearly in each parish a collection for the benefit of the Incapacitated Clergy Fund.

Speaking on his resolution Mr. Jarvis urged the necessity of assisting this fund and suggesting that a collection for it would be the best course.

The Lord Bishop stated that he had dealt with the question in his address to the Synod. The motion prevailed after considerable discussion.

Resolved that all collections and subscriptions for the Incapacitated Clergy Fund may be applied to present necessities, and not capitalized unless donors so desire, while fund itself shall consist of the money now on hand. Seconded by Rev. C. A. Schofield. The resolution was adopted because His Lordship expressed the desire that it be not pressed.

Canons to be Printed.  
Upon motion of Mr. W. M. Jarvis it was ordered that the canons be printed and distributed among the clergy and delegates to Synod.

The salary of the treasurer of Synod, Mr. W. E. Smith, was fixed at \$500, and of the secretary, Rev. O. S. Newham, at \$100.

Mr. W. M. Jarvis read the report of the 19th Century Thanksgiving Fund, and also a letter from the Primate of Canada approving of the scheme. Report adopted.

Upon motion of the Sunday School Committee the Bishop was requested to set apart one day each year for special intercession on behalf of Sunday Schools.

Archdeacon Neales presented the report of the committee on the Lord Bishop's address, which was adopted.

Very Rev. Dean Partridge and Mr. A. C. Fairweather were appointed upon the governing board of King's College.

Mr. Justice Hanington was appointed a trustee of Edgehill, the Church School for Girls.

The usual votes of thanks were extended to His Lordship the Bishop, the trustees of Church Hall, the citizens of Fredericton and the press.

Kingdom and fulfilling His promises to His Church.  
Resolved, that this meeting desires to express its thankfulness to Almighty God for His blessings in connection with the Foreign Mission Work of His church in the last century and to place on record its deep conviction that the cause of missions is the cause of Christ, and that it is the bounden duty and should be the earnest endeavor of every churchman to further by his influence, by the liberal devotion of his means, and by the faithfulness of his purpose, the extension of the Kingdom of our Lord and Saviour in the foreign mission field, and wherever his name and salvation are yet unknown to men.

It was moved by Rev. J. A. Richardson and seconded by Mr. J. P. Burchill and adopted.  
Whereas, in recent years there has been an unprecedented flow of immigration into the domestic mission field of the North West, resulting in a large increase of population, with very inadequate provision for the spiritual needs of the immigrants;

And whereas, the difficulty of supplying these needs has of late been greatly increased by the withdrawal of the aid hitherto so generally given by the S. P. G. and the C. N. S.;

And whereas it will be impossible to adequately provide for the missionary needs of the Church in the North West unless a much larger amount is contributed annually for Domestic Missions by the Church in Canada.

Resolved that this meeting earnestly commend the needs of the Domestic Mission field, and especially the Diocese of Algoma to the hearty sympathy and liberal support of every member of the church in Canada.

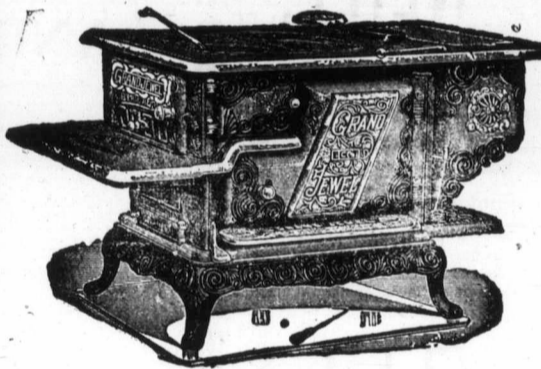
