FAIRMEN'S MARKET. The offerings of grain to-day were small. There was no wheat or barley. Wheat is quoted higher. Oats steady, 200 bushels selling at 30c.

LIVE STOCKS. The railways reported 55 carloads of live stock at the City Market, consisting of 811 cattle, 896 hogs, 132 sheep and lambs and 374 calves.

EXPORTERS—STEERS for export purposes did not reach as high as on Monday's market, in fact, there were not more than two loads on the market all told.
