

FAREWELL SERMON.

Parting Discourse of J. A. McGillivray, B. A., in Knox Church, Goderich.

There was a large congregation at Knox church on Sunday evening last to listen to the farewell sermon delivered by the assistant pastor, previous to his return to Knox College.

"In that day it shall be said to Jerusalem, Fear thou not; and to Zion, Let not thine hands be slack. The Lord thy God is in the midst of thee; he will save thee; he will rejoice over thee with joy; he will rest in his love; he will joy over thee with singing."

These words were spoken to the church of God then, and are spoken to the church of God now, for the church is one, then, now, and for all time. We should appropriate these words as our own.

The second point is, our Saviour is mighty. "He will save." He that is with us is mightier than we that can be against us. You can understand why I say let not your hands be slack, because God is with you in His own image, and to do of His own good pleasure.

But God does not stop at the work of justification. There is the great work of sanctification. Man could not carry on this work alone, even after the act of justification. The whole spirit had to be changed to love what God loves and to hate what God hates.

In the third place, see the sweet joy of God over His own people. "He will rest in His love; He will joy over thee with singing." It is grandest and best to know that the Almighty one who is with us loves us, and is happy in His love.

Notice, too, "He will rest in His love." A mother bending over her child gives but a faint picture of God in His infinite love bending over his own children in delight. A mother's love can see no hateful blemish in her child, though it be deformed or even idiotic.

God's name I would ask you to grasp the realities of these promises now, in this present life, where we so much need them because of the fears without and within.

My voice must reach the ears of some who know not the joy we speak of—this eternal joy, flowers that will live forever. I cannot say to such, Fear not, but I can say that the infinite love I speak of changes not.

Yet there is a sense in which we can say "Fear not," because "the Lord thy God is in the midst of thee." The preacher then told the story of the shipwrecked sailors who were famishing for water when a vessel had drifted into the mouth of the fresh water Amazon.

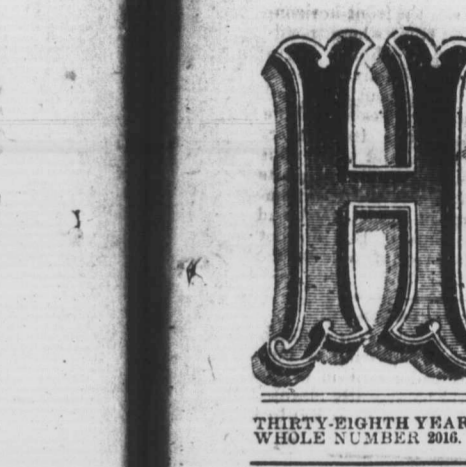
