The efforts of the Grand Trunk Pacific are being concentrated upon the completion of the line of steel to Edmonton this year.

On Saturday the first contingent of the steel to Edmonton has been received at the G.T.P. in taking the measures necessary to make certain the reaching of Edmonton this year.

With the completion of the work of this gang west from Battle River, the whole grade of the Grand Trunk Pacific between Winnipeg and Edmonton may be considered as finished.

It is unlikely the G.T.P. will do any construction work this summer west of the Pembina river.
