ASQUITH'S GREAT STATESMANSHIP

own power of veto. Liberals Badly Treated. London, Feb. 22.—Sir James H. Duff, who has been the more radical supporters of the government to a little group, numbering 20, including Sir Charles Dukes, Hilary Bell, and Joseph Martin, a former Canadian politician, who are pressing the government to deal with the veto bill before the House.

Walter Hume Long, speaking for the Opposition, twitted the government on the discrepancy of its views and those of its supporters. The government said was trying to work a revolution and at the same time play the part of constitutional ministers.

The negotiations between the government and the Nationalists, which had been temporarily suspended, were reopened in the afternoon. The Irish leaders laid their views before the cabinet urging the desirability of so amending the bill as to leave the question of the Lords' power of veto.

Nationalist Resolution. The political atmosphere continued heavy when parliament reassembled but a ray of hope appeared with the announcement that the Nationalists had decided not to move an amendment to the address in reply to the speech from the throne. The text of the Nationalist resolutions follows: Resolved, that having regard for the supreme importance of the constitutional struggle going on between the two houses of parliament, and being convinced that the primary business of the parliament was to act on the mandate given in general election, and proceed forthwith to limit the veto power now exercised by the House of Lords over all progressive legislation, the Irish party decided not to complicate that great issue by moving an amendment to the address or by balloting for bills and motions during the present session.

Defer Execution. The decision was accepted generally in the House, and Sir James Hume Long, the Nationalist leader, had rendered judgment against the government and his followers had decided to defer the execution of the sentence and not to throw out the cabinet over the budget while awaiting from supporting them a financial measure as they abstained in the last, and they realize that it would cease to be a live issue immediately upon the resignation or defeat of the government.

George N. Barnes, chairman of the parliamentary labor party, in a speech in the Commons, urged the Laborites with the Nationalists and demanded further assurance that Premier Asquith would not delay in dealing with the Lords power of veto. The Labor members, he said, believed that the House of Lords was a needless, irritating barrier to Democratic progress.

The elector, he added, expected decisive action and he wished to give assurances that if the veto question was not dealt with immediately it would be settled before the next budget was passed. Barnes declared that the Labor party was in favor of Home Rule.

Joe Martin Fighting Acrely. London, Feb. 22.—In the Commons Joe Martin, late tonight, caught the speaker's eye and raising his hand, maintained that the only reasonable interpretation to be put on Premier Asquith's Albert Hall speech was that he would "ask the King for the guarantee that he would if need be there be create enough new peers to force the issue in the House of Lords."

Two Suicides in Winnipeg. Winnipeg, Feb. 20.—Two suicides and an attempted one were the features of Sunday afternoon. George Deaux, 32, who came from Paris last November, shot himself through the head, dying instantly. He had been unsuccessful in securing employment. He was a clever fancy skater. His sister lives in Montreal. Twenty minutes later H. Swinicki hanged himself in a lonely shack on Higgins avenue. He tied a rope around his neck and dropped through a hole in the floor, from the first floor to the bottom.
