LONDON, August 13. The Daily Mail's Bucharest correspondent telegraphs that it is stated in diplomatic circles there that a future alliance of the Balkan peoples will be cemented by the following marriages: The Crown Prince George of Greece and Princess Elizabeth of Roumania; Crown Prince beth of Roumania; Crown Prince Alexander of Servia and Grand Duchess Olga, daughter of the Czar, and Crown Prince Charles of Roumania and Grand Duchess Titiana, second daughter of the Czar.

TOKIO, August 13. A hundred assassins are reported Sing and other Chinese revolutionary fugitives, by Provisional President Yuan Shi Kai, of China. The Japanese Government, in consequence of these reports, have arrangled to give police protection to the

leaders in the Chinese Revolution who sought an asylum in Japan. It declares, however it will not permit Japan to be used as headquarters for Chinese plotters.

That general feeling in England. seems to be rather apathetic on the statement made at the Chateau Frontenac by Lord John Thomas Manners, of London, England, who arrived by the steamship Megantic. The Home Rule question does not interest the English public to any extent, he feels; and there would be no great feeling among the English masses whether Parliament be established at College Green as red tablished at College Green or not. In reply to a question regarding the suffragettes and their tactics, he aid they had a great number of supmilitant outrages had lost them favor with the public. With regard to a candidate for parliament favoring the cause, he thought it would be unwise to air his opinions too much. To a query as to the feeling over Canada's naval policy, he remarked that the English believed in Canada doing as she pleased. England's affairs were safe in the hands of Winston Churchill.

BERLIN. August 13. Although some inkling of the new German Army law became public during the long debate in committee, and the more rapid discussion in the Reichstag, its full import was not learned until published this week in the official Reichsanzliger. Meanwhile all those concerned in the framing of the bill have been rewarded by the Chancellor with the Order of the Black Eagle. The Minister of War gets a commission as the bill, has been appointed to the Army, which ever since 1870 has been easily considered the most powerful in Europe, and after a dozen ncreases in the course of forty years and two small increases in 1911 and 1912, is now being increased in force by more than twenty per cent., and considerably reorganized in the bargain. The total peace strength will reach the enormous figure of 814,000. It is characteristic of the whole discussion that the only army mentioned in the German press, in comparison, is the French, which is given as 570,000 combatants. With the revival of the three years' service in France, German authorities estimate the French Army will have a peace footing of 730,000, giving the German Army a numerical superiority of 80,000.
