### Safer Roads Campaign

The Manchester Watch Committee is launching a big campaign to teach road sense, with the object of decreasing road accidents. During the next few days 1,000 posters, measuring 30 inches by 40 inches, will be placed on the boards of 500 hand-bills, distributed to motorists, 2,000 bills posted on schools and public buildings, and 2,000 forms supplied to school teachers.

In the schools the scholars will have the new safety rules constantly brought to their notice by their teachers.

Sir Robert Peacock, the chief constable, states that nearly one-third of the accidents during the past twelve months have been caused by persons stepping off the footpath in front of approaching vehicles.

Of the 53 fatal accidents, 28 occurred to persons under 21 years, indicating that there must have been great carelessness by children and

young persons when using the roads. The total number of fatal and non-fatal accidents during the year ended June 30, was 1,751.

The handbills and posters are intended to teach road sense and to emphasize that the safety rules should be strictly observed by all when using the streets for any purpose.

It is imperative that the number of accidents should be decreased, and the police force have strict instructions to prosecute anyone driv-

Dear Sir—Thank you for your courteous information about the location of that famous fishing scene and the means of transportation. As I said before I have no personal knowledge of these matters and am quite prepared to accept your assurance with regard to the carrying capacity of these motor boats. Sixty fish, averaging nine pounds each, were landed with the rod, in 4 hours, that is one such fish every four minutes. ### AND YET ANOTHER DOUBTING THOMAS.

Editor Evening Telegram.  
Dear Sir—As an experienced Waltonian, I have read with interest your report of the large catch (50 trout) in Fortune Bay, weighing 466 lbs., or over 9 lbs. per trout, in exactly four hours, as per Mr. Warren's letter published in the Evening Telegram of September 14th.

Like Mr. Tucker I must say I doubt very much the veracity of this "Fish Story," but as neither Mr. Tucker nor I have seen the size of the boat or the trout, I will attack the story on a different course, and that course is the time in landing the trout, which stands no argument.

I may say I have landed 25 trout weighing in all 125 lbs., and at another time 8 trout weighing 62 lbs., also a 17½ lb. trout which took me thirty-five minutes to land. The trout referred to in your letter average over nine pounds each, and I defy anyone to land a trout of this size in less than fifteen minutes, and this is the minimum time for this size of fish, caught fairly on a rod as per letter, and not even allowing for the loss of time in taking the fish from the hook or waiting for another rise, the best that could be done would be to land the lot in 12½ hours or fifteen minutes per trout, and not four hours, or under five minutes per trout, and this calculation does not even include the time catching the ten trout that were not weighed.

The West Hartlepool Corporation has authorized its borough engineer to experiment with the white safety lines on some of the roads.
