Death of an Old Timer. Edward Newton died at the Four-Mile House, yesterday, at 11:40 a. m. of bronchitis. His first attack of illness he felt on Sunday, and since that time he got worse steadily.

Coal Mine Regulations. It is worthy of mention that Mr. Keith, M. P. for Nanaimo, has given notice in the Legislature to amend the Coal Mine Regulation Act. He has not yet announced what will be the character of the legislation he proposes to initiate; but in all probability it will be directed by the Wellington mines.

Judge Sachs' Removal. The House of Representatives, in session at Olympia, on Wednesday night, decided to remove Judge Sachs by a vote of 62 yeas to 14 nays, and the Senate was to vote yesterday. It is upon the Senate particularly that the friends of Judge Sachs have depended, claiming that they had enough in that body to prevent the adoption of the joint resolution and consequent removal from office.

Communication with Australia. Mr. Horne's resolution which is now on the order paper of the local Legislature, and will be brought up at the earliest possible date, refers to the success which has attended the granting by the Dominion Government of a subsidy to the Canadian Pacific steamship line to China and Japan, and asks the House to address the Ottawa and Imperial authorities upon the advisability and necessity of subsidizing a Canadian line of steamships to Australia.

Police Pickings. There was a scarcity of drunks in the court, yesterday morning. Only two appeared to answer to the charge, and neither of them had any money they were both sentenced to one month's imprisonment. One was an Indian girl who had been supplied by E. Woods with the liquor. He was charged with supplying an Indian with an intoxicant, and pleaded not guilty. The case was remanded. His honor finally disposed of the restaurant-man's case by fining him \$35 in all, of which \$30 was for the license.

Attempted Suicide. A fast woman named Crystal Smith went into a drug store in New Westminster on Wednesday night and secured a small quantity of laudanum, which was given in a little phial. She paid for it and left, but had no sooner got outside than she uncorked the phial and swallowed the contents. Almost immediately she fell forward on the sidewalk and lay there unconscious. Constable Box picked her up a few minutes later and took her to the police station. A doctor was summoned, and after great trouble saved her life. She is very ill now, but as soon as she recovers will be tried for an attempt to take her own life. Her husband, who is a lawyer, has taken the responsibility over the life she was living was the cause.

Emma Juch Breaks the Record. The Emma Juch Opera company, en route to Ogden in the north, arrived at Wednesday evening in Idaho by a snow blockade. A special train was made on the west side of the blockade and all passengers and baggage transferred. The special train ran 70 miles in 4 1/2 hours. Emma Juch carrying out her engagement to a packed house. The performance lasted until 2 o'clock in the morning. The run from Idaho was the fastest ever made on the route. From China and Japan. The steership Batavia, Capt. Hill, from China and Japan, passed up last evening. Pilot Thompson boarded the vessel off the harbor and brought ashore late papers and the following news of the trip: Left Hong Kong February 21st, and arrived at Batavia Feb. 17th. Had heavy weather for some days after leaving Yokohama, followed by moderate winds and sea to port. Sighted Cape Beale March 5th, at 7 a. m., and arrived at Victoria on the 12th. The cargo, including 712 bales silk, 120 chests opium, a large quantity of rice, with tea and sundries. Her passengers are Messrs. F. Felous, W. S. Smith, 69 Chinese in steerage, and 24 Japanese in steerage.

REV. C. H. SPURGEON.

Interesting Lecture by Rev. C. W. Townsend, Last Evening in Emmanuel Baptist Church. The Emmanuel Baptist Church was crowded to the doors last evening, to hear the able lecture on Spurgeon, by Rev. C. W. Townsend. He said that C. H. Spurgeon was the most popular Methodist preacher. For more than 30 years he has had the largest congregation in the world. He was born on June 19th, 1834, at Kaldenon, England. His father was a respectable shop-keeper, his ancestors were not great, but gracious, when quite young he lived in his grandfather's home; as a boy he was very fond of books, and used to astonish elderly people by his peculiar questions and thoughtful remarks. When nine years old he was sent to a boarding school in Colchester, England. His early years were spent in the scholastic profession which he studied and was a man of no mean education. He was converted in his 15th year, under the teaching of an itinerant Methodist. His mother said to him that she often prayed that he might become a preacher, but never that he might become a Baptist. He said to her: "God has answered you more than you asked." He preached his first sermon in his 16th year, and at the age of 17 he received a call to the pastorate of a small church at Waterbeach, Cambridgehire. He was called to the pastorate upon his London ministry, at New Park street church. The place soon became too small to contain the crowds; it was necessary to take the Exeter hall during the enlargement of the church. At this time, he was soon through with his hearers. The great question everywhere was: "Who is this Spurgeon?" Many silly stories were circulated concerning him and many caricatures appeared in the newspapers. On Jan. 8, 1856, he married, and his domestic life has been a very happy one. In 1859 the first stone of his great Tabernacle was laid. It cost over \$150,000, and was opened in 1861, and has since been the scene of his work. It has become consolidated, and the immense building has always been crowded, and is one of the centres of spiritual activity and influence in the world. There are over 5,000 members of his congregation. The lecture gave some very interesting information concerning the chief departments of Mr. Spurgeon's work, as a preacher, writer and philanthropist. In conclusion he summed up his characteristics as follows: thoroughness, common sense, less industry, a wonderful combination of enthusiasm and common sense, mighty faith, Christian sincerity and consistency, and entire consecration to the service of Christ. The lecture had the attention of an audience throughout, and before closing a hearty vote of thanks was accorded him.
