Two Leaders

President Loubet and the King of Spain Receive a Bad Score.

As the Two Were Leaving the Opera House an Explosion Occurred.

Bomb Thrown by Anarchists Who Awaited Them at the Entrance.

PARIS, June 1.—As the King of Spain and President Loubet drove away from a performance of the opera after midnight, an anarchist threw a bomb in the direction of the royal carriage. The projectile struck a soldier belonging to the escort on the shoulder, fell to the ground and exploded, wounding King Alfonso and the President.

After the performance King Alfonso and President Loubet proceeded down the grand staircase and arrived at the exit illuminated and escorted by several platoons of cuirassiers, towards the Avenue d'Opera. The crowd round the opera house was packed for two hundred yards and the result was a dense throng which impeded the passing of the royal and presidential carriages.

At that moment a deafening explosion occurred. Cries from the crowd were heard and the scene of excitement began. Soldiers were seen to fall, but before the flash from the bomb and the President and King were hurled into the air.

Prospects for Peace

Washington, D. C., May 31.—While President Roosevelt has discussed informally the subject of peace negotiations with some representatives of foreign governments at this capital, and in the near future probably will take up the matter with other powers, it can be said authoritatively that no definite steps look toward peace yet has been taken by the United States government. That a conference of several nations is in the air is a reasonable certainty. The result of such an effort is quite another matter.

Admiral Rojestvensky Assuredly a Prisoner at Tokio and is Badly Wounded.

Captain of Sunken Battleship Describes His Own Fearful Experience.

Nearly Six Hundred Men Went Down With Torpedoed Ship.

TOKIO, June 31.—(5 p. m.)—It is now certain that Admiral Rojestvensky is a prisoner of the Japanese. He is wounded in the forehead, legs and back, but will recover. Vice Admiral Voikovitch is supposed to have perished. The reported capture of the battleship is not confirmed, and the name of the cruiser has been dropped from the list of vessels.

On arriving at Sydney the Japanese, after hearing of the other warships, declined to continue the pursuit. The Russian fleet is reported to have been sighted on the 27th of the month.

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NEW YORK STOCKS.
