It is true that the last bank statement showed an amount of surplus reserve 118 per cent. higher than that of the same date in 1890 and 1889; but it is also true that the west will have a wholly unprecedented surplus of wheat to send east, which places us in a condition of very delicate dependence on the problematical disposition of Europe to exchange its gold for our grain. Under these circumstances it would be almost impossible to borrow large amounts of money impossible to borrow large amounts of mone; for long purchases of stocks even did the con ditions happen to encourage such purchases.




